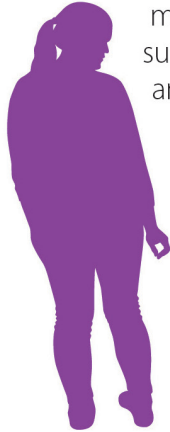
LEGAL ADVOCACY HOTLINE

Hotline advocates spent an average of 31 minutes per call.

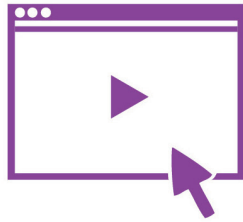

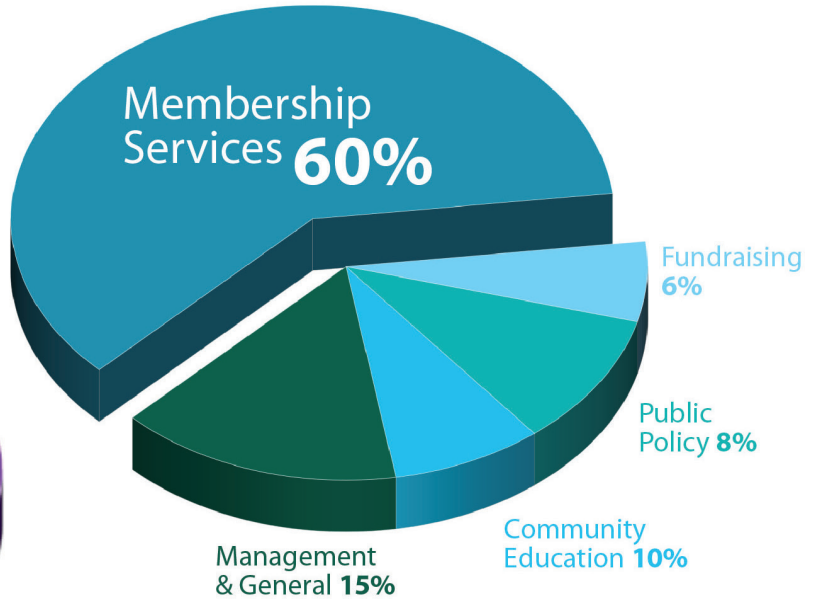
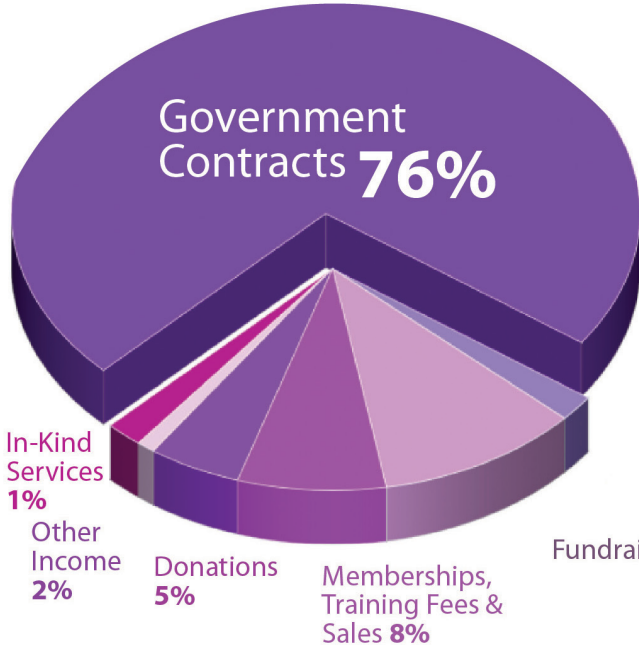
