Barrier Reduction Collaborative (BaRC) Update

Hello friends,

We're excited to share some updates about the work ACESDV is doing to support survivors of domestic violence and their beloved pets.



Since 2018, ACESDV has been focused on increasing access to petinclusive services for survivors across Arizona. We know that pets are family —and for many people, the ability to keep that family together is vital to their healing and safety. More domestic violence programs across the state are embracing this approach, and we're proud to help lead the way.

Recently, Lauryn Fjell and I had the opportunity to speak at two national conferences about the connection between domestic violence, pets, and homelessness. These conversations are essential, because when we talk about safety, we must also talk about housing—and the role that pets play in both. The response has been incredibly positive, and we're honored that Arizona's efforts are inspiring others.

In September, I'll be sharing more about this work at the Nevada Coalition Conference, highlighting the steps Arizona programs have taken to support survivors and their animals. It's our hope that more communities across the country will join this movement.

We're also thrilled to be partnering with the University of Arizona's School of Veterinary Medicine and Purina for an upcoming event on October 18th in recognition of Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM). More details to come!

Lastly, while we currently have funding for rental assistance (including pet deposits), many survivor needs still go unfunded—things like pet carriers, boarding costs, medical care, food, and even toys. Our Helpline team continues to help survivors and their pets every day, and we're always grateful for additional support from the community.

Thank you for being part of this journey. Together, we're creating a safer, more compassionate future for every survivor—and every pet.

Stay tuned for our next merch drop, coming soon.


